Chris holds a doctorate in ethics from the Accademia Alfonsiana in Rome, Italy where he lived and attended school for eight years. He taught in the field of social ethics for many years before coming to Massachusetts General Hospital in 2006. He is currently the Director of Interpreter Services at MGH and he sits on the Board of FOCIS (Forum of Coordinators of Interpreter Services) which gathers coordinators of Interpreter Service Departments from all over New England, New York and beyond. He is the coach of the MGH Collaborative Governance Diversity and Inclusion Committee. He oversaw the launch of video medical interpreting at MGH in 2008 and is continually invested in putting technology into the hands of his staff to facilitate their work in services of their patients. Chris has co-authored two articles in peer reviewed journals on the importance of the use of interpreter services for vulnerable populations. Chris was a long-standing member of the Collaborative Governance Ethics in Clinical Practice Committee.
