


Perspectives and Attitudes Towards Substance Use Disorder and

Expanding drug rehab programs and facilities is the top priority of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe in Rosebud, South Dakota



Rates of substance dependence or abuse among people 12 or older:

14.9% American Indians or Alaska Natives (AI/AN)

11.3% Native Hawaiians or Other Pacific Islanders

10.9% Two or more races

8.6% Hispanics

8.4% Whites

7.4% Blacks

4.6% Asians

Prescription Pain Reliever Misuse among Al/AN **nearly** doubles that of US general population among 26 and older

In the past, Rosebud substance use disorder treatment

took an **abstinence-only** approach. Now, medications for opioid use disorder are available. Better **understanding** of Rosebud community, patient and clinician **perspectives** on substance use disorders and medications for treatment of addiction will help create **locally informed best practices**.

- 1)Get **feedback** from patients and clinicians **engaged in treatment** of opioid use disorder and methamphetamine use disorder
- 2)Hear attitudes from the community on substance use disorder and treatment options
