Application Opens: Friday, November 14, 2026 Application Closes: Friday, January 9, 2026, 5 p.m. ET	All questions listed on the application are required and help us best determine internship placements. Access the application on our website. You will be asked to provide: • Resume/CV • One letter of recommendation • Academic transcript (unofficial accepted)
Candidate interviews: January – February 2026	If selected to move to the interview stage, candidates will participate in a 15-minute Zoom interview.
Decision Release: March – April 2026	Applicants will be notified of their acceptance via email and are required to accept or decline by the date specified in the letter.
Mandatory Zoom Orientation: Tuesday, June 2, 2026, 12-1pm	A Zoom orientation will be held on Tuesday, June 2nd, from 12-1pm, to ensure onboarding is complete and answer any questions before the first day.
Program Start Date: Monday, June 8, 2026	The start of the 2026 8-week MGB Biomedical Research Internship Program! You will receive information about your first day from your faculty mentor.
Program End Date: Friday, July 31, 2026	The end of the 2026 MGB Biomedical Research Internship Program!
Program Information: • Interns receive a stipend of \$4,500 after successful completion of the internship program • Interns are required to live in the Greater Boston area and commute to the MGH campus/off-site labs • In-person internship; 100% in-person participation for wet labs, possibility of hybrid schedule for dry labs, but hybrid schedules will be determined between intern and mentor at the start of the program
