
In 2021, **1,205 women** died of maternal causes in the United States.¹

Black women are **two to three times more likely to die from pregnancyrelated complications** than white women, with most of the maternal deaths being preventable.²


WHO WE ARE

PROJECT OVERVIEW


AmeriHealth Caritas DC has a high volume of maternity health-related data in various forms; however, this multi-format and multi-location data environment can limit clarity and usability of the data. There is a need to improve organization and aggregation of the available data in order to gain better clarity on the health of our maternal health program.



PROJECT GOALS

- Enhance maternal health surveillance by improving data architecture through a robust dashboard to capture and report key data elements needed to create specific interventions that address pre-pregnancy medical and social needs.
- **Identify a process** to assess barriers that may be preventing enrollees from engaging with care during their pregnancy.
